



Sunday School's Origins

Englishman Robert Raikes, born in 1735, was a Christian layman who was pained to see unschooled children working six days a week in factories or mines. On Sundays, children roamed the streets, often getting into trouble. Most didn't know how to read or write and knew nothing about Christ or the church.



As Raikes labored to reform England's prison system, he noticed that many children were imprisoned, stirring him to action on their behalf. He arranged for halls and homes to be used for educational purposes on Sundays, the one day children didn't have to work. He found volunteers to teach reading, writing and math, as well as the Bible and Christian

The first Sunday school class was held in July 1780. Amazingly, by 1788 some 250,000 children were attending such schools. This occurred despite some people's opposition to the education of lower-class children.

Countless boys and girls have attended Sunday school classes since then, thanks to Raikes, who brought Christ's light and love to children around the world.

As stewards, we ponder: When God calls us home, what will our garden be like, and what will it have produced?





What you need:


Large bowlWooden spoon

- 8 cups flour
- 1 cup baby oil



What you do:

- 1. Measure flour into the large bowl. Add baby oil.
- Mix thoroughly until all the oil is combined and the texture is consistent. If needed, use your hands to knead the mixture.
- The sand is ready when it sticks together to form a ball when pressed in your hands.
- Use sand toys and molds to create a sandcastle. Store sand in an airtight container for up to two weeks.
