

There's a word that pops up multiple times in the New Testament: koinonia. For a simple definition, this Greek word means fellowship and community. The word first appears in Acts 2:42, which tells how the disciples were "continually devoting themselves to the apostles' teaching and to koinonia, to the breaking of bread, and to prayer." In I Corinthians, Paul says "God is faithful, through whom you were called into koinonia (fellowship) with His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord." Scripture tells us to have fellowship with God, with others, and with the Holy Spirit.



Part of being the church is sharing ourselves: we share our life stories and listen to others' stories. We share our gifts with each other, whether it's making cards or serving on committees or any number of gifts I've seen around the church. Koinonia means sharing what we have. In Acts II, Barnabas, Paul, and other followers (who are soon called Christians) give the Gospel to those who have not yet heard. And the Antioch church gives financially, each according to his ability, to the Jerusalem church when famine hits.


